4x more

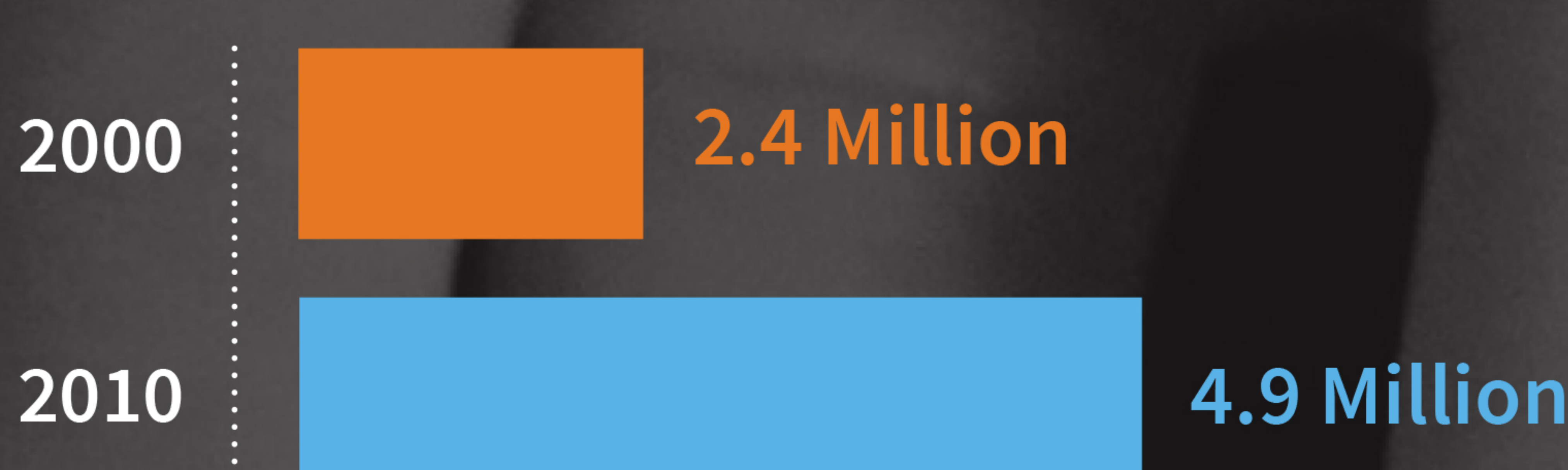
likely to develop alcoholism later in life.¹

From 2000 to 2010, the number of children being raised by grandparents more than doubled¹



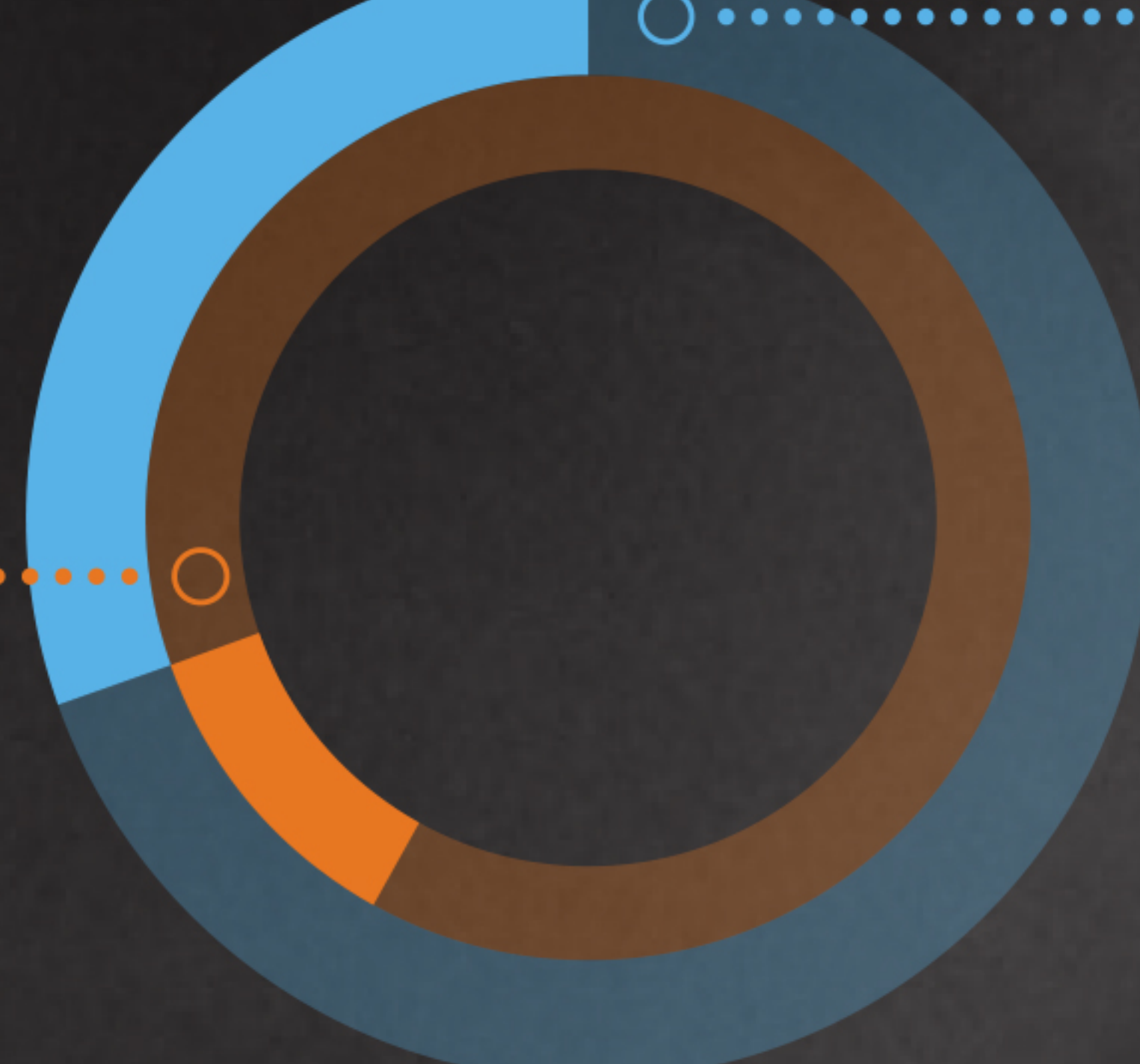
Children Raised By Grandparents
